

What to bring

Since we must travel 20 miles by cabin cruiser across a lake to reach the camp and carry many people and their gear at a time, we ask that you travel as light as possible.

The most important thing to bring, more important even than your fishing gear, is excellent rainwear, including waterproof boots. If you can stay dry in bad weather, you will always be comfortable.

♦ **Average daytime highs are: May 60s, June 70s, July and August 75-85, September 60s.**

Guests coming in May or September might want a set of heavy clothes. No matter when you come, bring both a swimsuit and long underwear!

T-shirts and jeans or shorts with lightweight boots or sneakers are comfortable almost all summer.

You'll want a jacket for morning and evenings. Don't forget sunscreen.

And, oh yes, bring a spare set of car keys!

Housekeepers, support the Red Lake fishing industry by buying your groceries here. You will have more room on the trip up allowing you to drive a more fuel-efficient vehicle and save gas and money.

Ask to have your groceries packed in boxes instead of bags. This is a common request here.

Please, do not bring...

1. Electrical appliances. Our generator and electrical system cannot handle them. Ladies, small hair-dryers are OK.
2. Beer and soft drinks in glass bottles. Bring cans instead. Try to avoid glass jars of food items if possible as well.
3. Heavy coolers of ice.
4. Duffel bags and totes big enough to hide a body.
5. More food and drink than needed for your stay.
6. Cast iron pots and pans. Our cabins are outfitted with cast iron frying pans already. If you need a special-size pot, ask to borrow one at the lodge.
7. Barbecues and charcoal. We have them for you.
8. Propane fish cookers and 20-pound tanks. We can loan you one.

New - Bringing your own boat

You may do so if you wish. Twelve Imperial gallons (15 U.S.) of gasoline furnished without charge per week. You must park your boat trailer in a different location from our dock in Red Lake for a fee of \$35. Please bring 200 feet of extension cord if you need to plug in your boat at camp.

How to meet us

Our loading dock is adjacent to Red Lake Marine on Highway 105 as you enter the town of Red Lake. Our cabin cruiser will meet you at a predetermined time (complete and send in Reservation Form). There is free parking for your vehicle at our dock.

Gratuities

Our staff works long hours in all kinds of weather to make your trip as enjoyable and relaxing as possible. Many guests acknowledge this dedicated service with a gratuity at the end of the week. The amount of this gratuity is strictly up to you but many guests use 10 per cent of their bill as a rule-of-thumb.

We accept personal checks for final payment only from returning guests.

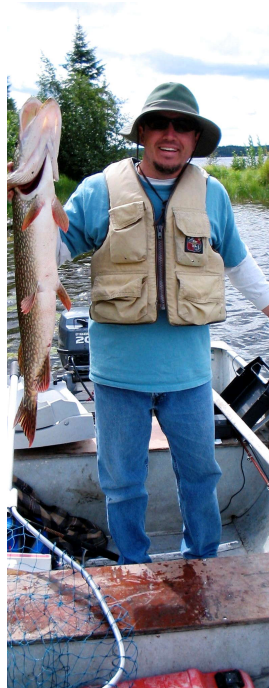
Deposits
